KANE LACK NEW CLUB CHAMPION

The 36 hole final was one of the best matches played for the Club Championship. During the morning round Kane was up by three holes for most of the first eighteen. Going into the eighteenth hole, DJ was again three down. DJ won the hole with a birdie and was down two as the afternoon session started.

The afternoon round went the same way with DJ battling to get some momentum going, to close the three hole lead. Kane was playing good smart golf and not making any mistakes. DJ however, did not seem to panic or get frustrated with Kane's steady play.

Going into the 15th hole, DJ was down by 4. It looked bleak for the past champion and young UC San Diego student. The 15 hole was pivotal with both players missing the green with their approach shots. Kane made a poor chip, but still had a par putt. DJ's chip was not his best, but it was on the uphill side of a back pin. After both missed their par putts, DJ made the bogey putt to win the hole and kept the match going. Down by three with three to play it would be a massive up hill battle for DJ.

The 16th hole had both players in the fairway with Kane on the right side. In an uncharacteristic move Kane, hit his approach shot into the creek. Thus giving the hole to DJ. So with two to play, Kane was up two, (with DJ finally get-

ting some momentum). DJ hit a great drive into the go for the green-in- two zone. Kane, on the other hand was standing in the bunker with the ball above him. Kane made a great shot to advance the ball into the hundred yard area. DJ, however, hit a great second shot that hit the green and was six feet above a blue pin location on the left center of the green. DJ had a slippery six footer for eagle. In the meantime Kane had gotten his third shot on the green and had a chance at birdie. Kane then missed his birdie putt while DJ barely missed the six footer coming back down the hill. Kane conceded the birdie putt and DJ was one down with one to play.

DJ tee shot was long and to the left side of the fairway. While Kane also hit a huge drive, but out to the right. This meant he would have to get over the bunkers and then stop the ball. DJ hit a good shot just to the left of the middle pin. DJ missed his birdie putt. The ball was tracking to the hole but just slid off at the last second. So after 36 holes of golf, the last hole was the deciding hole for the club championship. Kane won 1 up over DJ.

NET AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFING

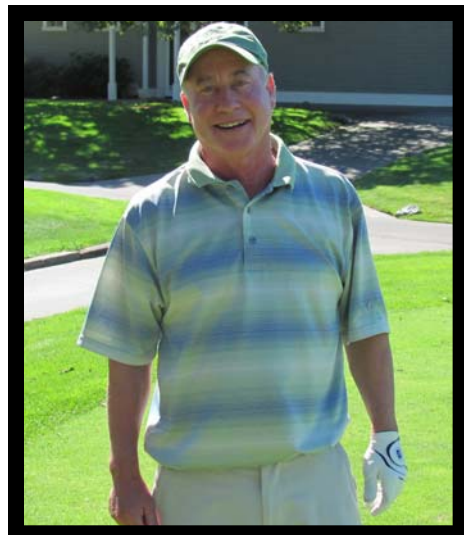
