

WINDSOR MEN'S GOLF CLUB POSTING GOLF SCORES

“Two basic premises underlie the USGA Handicap System, namely that each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played, and that the player will post every acceptable round for peer review. The player and the players Handicap Committee have joint responsibility for adhering to these premises.” (USGA)

“In its simplest form, peer review is the ultimate check and balance within the system that truly gives handicapping a backbone and integrity. A portion of peer review includes the unalienable right that we all possess to review the scoring records and handicaps of those we play with to insure that all is in order... If you want a Handicap Index, you must expose your scoring record to the review of others. If you are not willing to expose your scores to the review of others, you cannot have a Handicap Index. The choice is simple.”(NCGA)

It is a primary purpose of the Windsor Men's Golf Club Governing Board
“To uphold the uniform system of handicapping as set forth in the regulations of the Northern California Golf Association (NCGA), in cooperation with the United States Golf Association (USGA)” (By Laws of Windsor Men's Golf Club). When a member contacts the Board regarding a handicapping concern of an individual member, it is the responsibility of the Board to investigate the validity of the concern and bring it to a satisfactory conclusion.
