Local Rules June 13, 2014

Windsor Men's Golf Club tournament play is governed by the current editions of the USGA Rules of Golf and the Decisions on the Rules of Golf.

Silos on the Hole 3

In this competition the silos on 3rd hole are deemed to be integral parts of the golf course.

Out of Bounds behind Hole 3 green

The area behind the 3rd hole, defined by white stakes and the inner edge of the cart path, is out of bounds.

Inside the course Out of Bounds while playing the 17th Hole

While playing the 17th hole, a ball that crosses the white stakes located to the left of the 17th hole teeing area and comes to rest on the 2nd hole side of the white stakes is out of bounds.

Dropping Zones (Ball Drops)

In this competition a player shall not use the dropping zones located on holes 5 and 13.

Pace of Play

The Windsor Men's Golf Club's Pace of Play policy is in effect for this competition.

Time of Starting

The clock at the tee where the player begins his stipulated round is the official time of starting (Decision 6-3a/2.5).

Stones in Bunkers

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies).

Embedded ball

Through the green, a ball that is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground, other than sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green.

Global Positioning Systems and Hand Held Range Finders

Distance-Measuring Devices: In this competition a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, if, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

Aeration Holes

Through the green, a ball that comes to rest in or on an aeration hole may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped, as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green.

On the putting green, a ball that comes to rest in or on an aeration hole may be placed at the nearest spot not nearer the hole that avoids the condition.

Permanent Elevated Power Lines and Cables

If a ball strikes a permanent elevated power line or cable on the course, the stroke shall be cancelled and replayed, without penalty (See Rule 20-5). If the ball is not immediately recoverable, another ball may be substituted.
